

Note to Parents

Camp Barstow will be the highlight of your son's year in Scouting. Activities mentioned in this brochure are only part of the great adventure awaiting your son at Camp Barstow. Your son's Scoutmaster has more detailed information on Camp Barstow. Check with your son's Scoutmaster to find out when his troop will be having its Camp Promotions night including a 10 minute video showing highlights of Camp Barstow.

A Scout can register to attend camp either with his troop or as an individual. We recommend that a Scout attend at least one week with his own troop at camp. Register your son for one or more weeks of fun at camp.

Each Wednesday evening is parents-visitors night. Parents are encouraged to bring a picnic supper or join us in the dining hall for \$2.50 each. Then, enjoy watching your son participate in the Barstowree and attend the dramatic Order of the Arrow ceremony at the campfire ring overlooking Lake Urquhardt.

Scouts check-in between 2-4 p.m. on Sunday and checkout between 10-11 a.m. on Saturday. Contact your son's Scoutmaster for specific travel arrangements.

New for '91: Venture Program!

New challenges for older Scouts.

Are you ready for a new challenge at Camp Barstow? Well, we've got it with the new Venture Program. Venture will be a diverse program featuring many challenges which will combine for a super fun and challenging experience. We will have a BMX course for you to race against the clock to try to get the top time in the camp. How about Challenge Valley? Your crew can test themselves to the limit as you work your way through this cross country confidence course. Teamwork intensive obstacles and challenges, ultimateering, pioneering, and barriers will test your physical and mental abilities to the limit! There will also be time for more serious pursuits, such as daily Life to Eagle Workshops to help Life Scouts plan their advancement to the Eagle Rank. Emphasis will be on service project design and implementation, Eagle application procedures, where to get help on required merit badges, and most importantly, setting a personal goal for reaching Eagle and determining steps and check points for getting there.

The Venture Program will be limited to Star Scouts, or any Scout at least 14 years old with Scoutmaster's approval.

Trading Post

No trip to camp is complete without a few visits to the Trading Post. The Trading Post will be open daily and will sell soft drinks, candy, and other snacks as well as handicraft items, camp program items (compasses, knives, Merit Badge books, etc.), and Camp Barstow T-shirts, coffee mugs, belts, and patches. So be sure to come prepared to enjoy the Trading Post offerings!



Camp fees

The fee for attending Camp Barstow is \$95. However, if you pay the *Early Bird* deposit of \$30 by April 19 and pay the balance by June 7, you get a \$10 discount, making the fee only \$85! The fee for Scouts outside of the Indian Waters Council is an additional \$5. All fees need to be paid at least one week prior to your arrival at Camp Barstow.

Physical Exams

All campers must have a physical exam before going to camp. If you have had an exam in the last three years, your parents may sign and update your medical form. Summer camp medical forms are available from your Scoutmaster or the Council Service Center.





