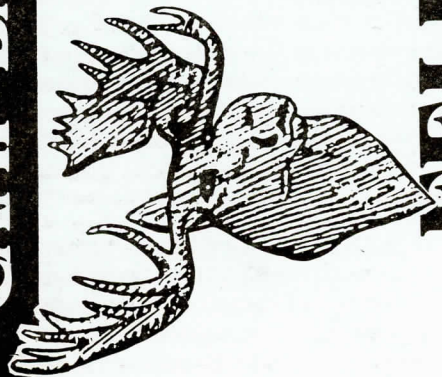

SPECIAL PROGRAMS

In addition to our traditional camping program, Camp Barstow offers some great special programs for those with special interests.

Pathfinder Program

THE CONCEPT A Scout's first year at summer camp should be a fun-filled learning experience which helps him advance in rank, teaches him basic patrol methods and improves his Scouting skills. This program gives the Scout who has not yet reached second class some special fun and training.

THE PROGRAM A specially trained staff Scoutmaster will give Scouts in this program an action-packed Scouting experience. The Scouts will sleep and eat most meals with their troop, but will spend their days learning in a model troop. By the end of the week each Scout will have completed most requirements for first class! In addition, these Scouts will complete requirements for the First Aid, Cooking and Swimming skill awards, and complete most of the requirements for Hiking and Camping skill awards. Scouts in this program will also receive a special orientation session to acquaint them with Camp Barstow.

The Barstow Voyager Program

THE CONCEPT To provide older, more experienced Scouts with an exciting, adventure-packed week of Scouting fun.

THE PROGRAM This high-adventure week

away from Barstow will take place mostly in the Smokey Mountains and will include backpacking, white-water rafting and canoeing. Designed for older Scouts, this program will be offered only the 2nd, 3rd and 4th weeks of camp.

SPECIAL REQUIREMENTS Scouts in this program must have had a minimum of two long term camping experiences and be at least First Class Scout or 13 years of age to attend.

Special Disability Week

This week is devoted to special Scouts and non-Scouts from the Babcock Center and other similar organizations and programs. Through this program, Camp Barstow is available to those with special disabilities. Scouting fun and enjoyment, for a special group of people. Contact the Council Service Center for more information.

Aquatics Week

This special week will include all waterfront merit badges as well as Lifeguard, BSA. Designed for those already classified as swimmers, this program will fine-tune your skills and qualify you for future camp staff positions.

Parent Visitor Night

Every Wednesday evening during the regular weeks of camp, parents and visitors are invited to camp. Most parents bring a picnic supper for the family or dine with their Scouts in the Barstow Dining Hall (6-6:30, \$2.50, call for reservations by Tuesday). At 7:00 the Scouts participate in the Barstowree, a demonstration of Scouting skills. That evening the Order of the Arrow tap-out ceremony is held in the Indian Pageantry Arena.

The Camp

Camp Barstow is 962 acres of fun and high adventure located in a beautiful wooded valley in central South Carolina. Camp Barstow for over 50 years has offered Scouts from all over the Southeast outstanding facilities, great activities and programs, and a true Scouting adventure. Barstow is located 16 miles from Columbia on Highway 321 South near Gaston, S.C.



The Program

The Barstow program offers you a full week of activities designed to suit your particular needs and interests. Do you want to learn to sail? We've got it. Archery, marksmanship, skeet shooting? It's here! Swimming, lifesaving courses, canoeing? A Barstow speciality...Or maybe nature and hiking is your thing. Be our guest. We have over 40 merit badges and skill awards, in addition to first and second class and tenderfoot, taught by a staff of some of Scouting's most outstanding young leaders. 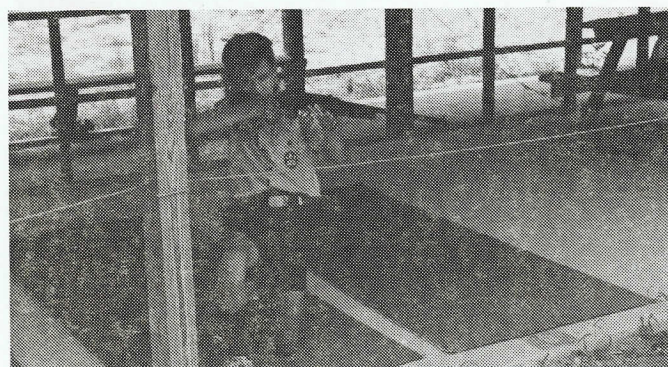
Meals and Evening Activities

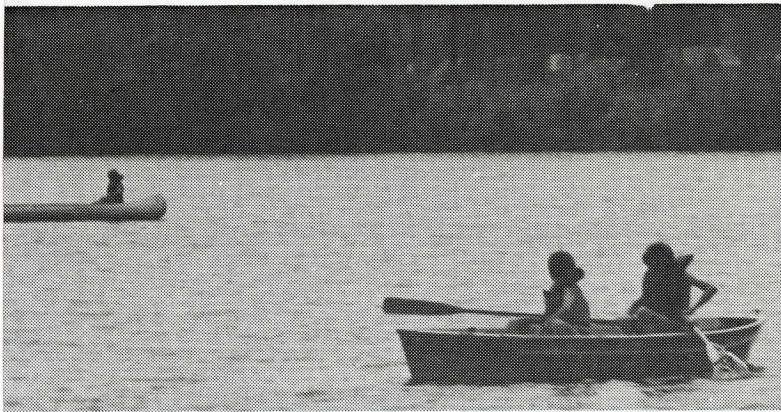
CAMP BARSTOW

Camp Barstow is a nationally certified, accredited camp and receives an "A" rating from the Boy Scouts of America. The Camp Director, Camp Ranger, Program Director, Field Sports Director, Aquatic Director and Camp Commissioners are trained and certified by the National Camp School of the Boy Scouts of America. In addition, many staff members have received American Red Cross C.P.R. training.

| 9:00 am to 12:00 | Morning Opportunity Sessions—Choose from over 40 merit badges and rank advancements or enjoy some free time around camp or at the Rec Hall. |

| 1:00 pm | Siesta, free time to spend with your troop or just to relax. |
| 2:00 pm | Afternoon Opportunity Sessions—More merit badges, maybe go sailing or take a hike down Barstow's nature trail. |

Physical Exam

Each Scout is required to have a medical exam by a licensed physician prior to attending camp. However, you need only have the physician review your son and sign the form if he has had a physical exam within the last three years. Physical forms are available from your Scoutmaster or the Council Service Center. There is no provision for an examination at camp; however, during camp the Health Lodge is staffed by a qualified health officer. Accident and sickness insurance is included in the camp fee.

Deposit

A \$25 deposit must accompany your registration for each week of camp your son will be attending. The balance of the fee is due at or before camp. This deposit is non-refundable but is transferable.

What To Bring

1.—EACH SCOUT SHOULD HAVE: sleeping bag or 2 sheets and 2 blankets - pajamas - flashlight - extra pair shoes - socks - T-shirts - undershorts - uniforms - wind breaker - poncho or raincoat - belt - pocket knife (no switch blades or sheath knives) - toilet articles (toothbrush, paste, soap, etc.) - towels and wash cloths - insect repellent - short pants - swim suit - 1 pair long pants and long-sleeve button up shirt with collar if you are taking any waterfront merit badge - money for some handicrafts (\$10-\$15) and Trading Post - handkerchiefs - Scout handbook.

2.—EACH SCOUT MIGHT BRING: camera and film - musical instrument - small pillow - pack frame and pack (if you plan to go out of camp on an overnight) - ground cloth - watch - compass - sun glasses - sun screen - note book and pencil - first aid kit - nature books - Bible.

So How Do I Sign Up?

Easy, just complete the attached form and return it with your deposit to your Scoutmaster or directly to the Indian Waters Council Service Center. Camp Barstow is a troop experience as well as a Scout experience, so try to attend with your troop. If you can't make it with your troop or if you will be staying an extra week, you will be camping in a special provisional troop under staff supervision.
