## 1ST TIME CAMPERS PATHFINDER PROGRAM

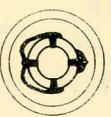

#### **WHAT IF MY TROOP'S NOT GOING TO CAMP BARSTOW?**

If your troop's not camping at Camp Barstow this summer, you can attend as a "Provisional Camper," and spend the week with a quality troop from your area. Just fill out the attached application and mail it in as soon as possible.

Your troop doesn't have to be in camp at all for you to participate in either of the High Adventure programs.

#### **CAN I ATTEND FOR MORE THAN ONE WEEK?**

Absolutely! You can attend as many weeks as you want--with your troop, as a provisional camper, and/or in the High Adventure programs. (Of course, you have to pay for each week!)

#### **HOW DO I SIGN UP?**

Check with your Scoutmaster to see when your troop is going to Camp Barstow.

If you can't come with your troop, want to attend for an extra week, or are signing up for high adventure programs, simply complete the attached application and send it in with your deposit.
