

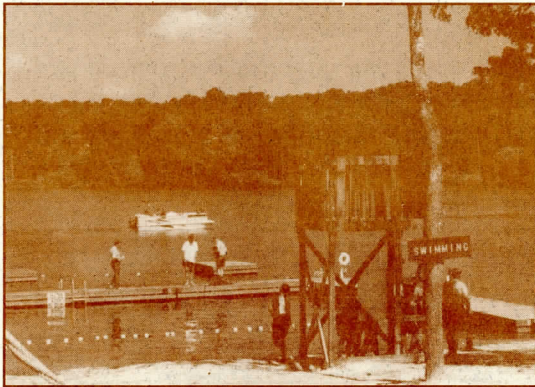

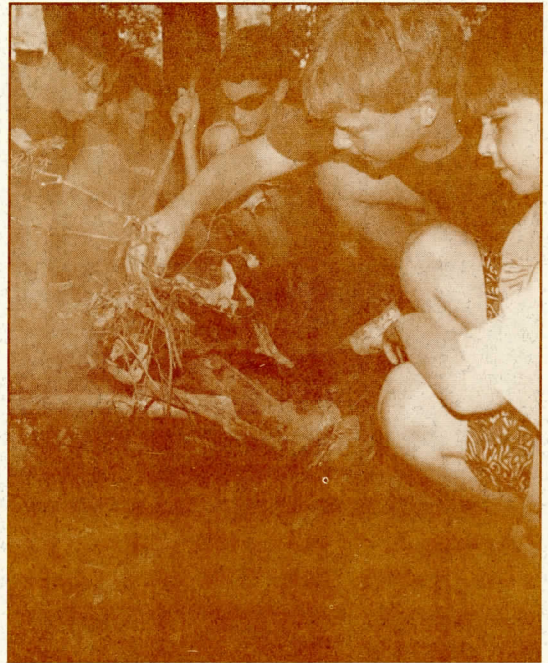

Camp Barstow Action Centers

Camp Barstow offers a wide range of Action Centers for all Scouts, first year and up. The Action Centers are structured for use during free time and are designed to expose scouts to many different activities in camp. No level of proficiency is required. The Action Centers are daily afternoon activities. To participate a Scout must simply go to the center and give it a try.

Pathfinder Program

The Pathfinder Program is designed for the new scout. A young Scout will learn basic skills required to reach the rank of First Class. Along with the learning of skills each scout will participate in the overnight hike and campout; so bring your backpack and sleeping bag. This is a morning daily program. So be sure to participate in the afternoon activities.

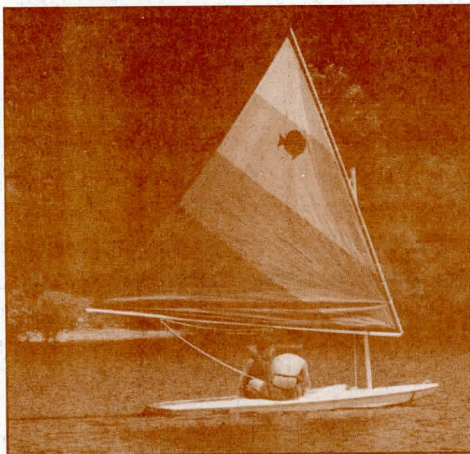
ADVENTURE TREKS

This summer Camp Barstow will feature a weekly Adventure Trek that boys may take part in. Each trek is designed for those boys ages 14 and older who have completed many of the traditional camp merit badges and are looking for some challenge and adventure.

Only one trek will be offered during each week of summer camp. Be sure to ask which trek is being offered the week you attend. Have a real **blast** this summer and attend summer camp with your troop for a week of traditional camping and merit badge study. Then come back another week and take part in one of the Adventure Treks!

Saluda Trek

Begin the week learning how to do rock climbing and rappelling on the 40' tower. Then take to the water to learn the basics of sail boarding and kayaking on the big water. After you get that under your belt, take off for an overnight canoe trip down the Saluda River. This trek gives you a taste of high adventure on the water *and* above the ground.



Whitewater Trek

Take off for the mountains for a memorable week. Spend three days hiking in the scenic Appalachian Mountains. Learn and practice the art of Scout backpacking with your crew. On the fourth day strap on your helmet for a whitewater rafting trip down one of the raging rivers of the Blue Ridge. Spend your last night sharing tales around the campfire before returning home.

The cost for each of these trips is just \$45 on top of the regular camp fee (or \$170 for in-council and \$185 for out-of-council). Boys attending camp for an adventure trek come as provisional campers and do not need to come the same week as their troop. They will be placed with troops at camp but will spend much of their time outside of Camp Barstow. Space for these trips is limited, so please register early.

HIGH ADVENTURE

A special week of high adventure featuring a full aquatics experience will be offered this year (June 28 thru July 2). Activities include sailing, motorboating, water skiing, board sailing and many more exciting activities geared especially towards young adults, older Scouts, Varsity Scouts and Explorers age 14-20. The cost for the program is \$100 (all program fees included). No merit badge classes will be offered.

Provisional Scout and Adventure Trek Application

Please include a \$50 non-refundable but transferable deposit along with your application.

Complete fees must be paid by May 14, 1998.

All high adventure participants must be at least 14 years of age. All age requirements are as of January 1, 1998.

For Scouts attending traditional summer camp with their troop, please register with the troop at a cost of \$125. DO NOT USE THIS FORM.
