## Camp Barstow 1999

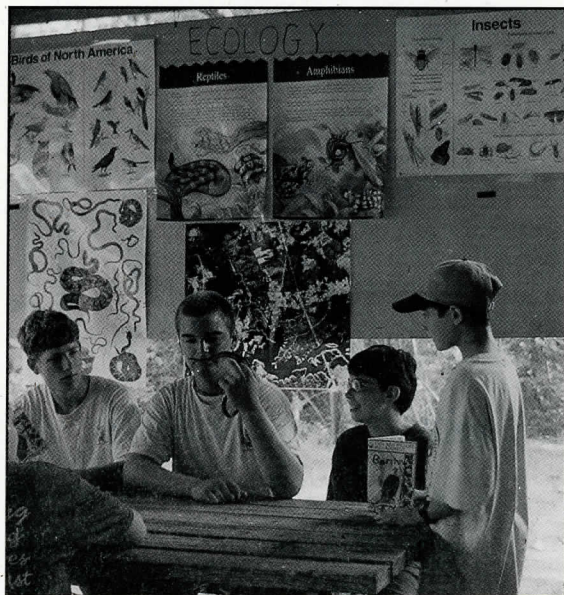

### TNT - The New Trail

TNT is a fantastic opportunity for Tenderfoot Scouts to work on all the requirements for Second class and First class. Since TNT is an afternoon activity, you can take morning merit badge classes.

### Pathfinder Program

The Pathfinder Program is designed for the new scout. A young Scout will learn basic skills required to reach the rank of First Class. Along with the learning of skills, each scout will participate in the overnight hike and campout so bring your backpack and sleeping bag. This is a morning daily program, so be sure to participate in the afternoon activities.

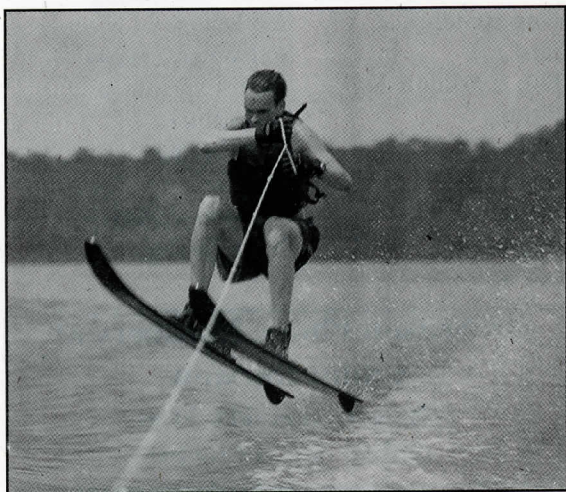
## ADVENTURE TREKS

Camp Barstow features a weekly Adventure Trek in which boys may participate. Each trek is designed for those boys ages 14 and older who have completed many of the traditional camp merit badges and are looking for some new challenges and adventures.

Only one trek will be offered during each week of summer camp. Be sure to ask which trek is being offered the week you plan to attend. Have a real *blast* this summer and attend summer camp with your troop for a week of traditional camping and merit badge study. Then come back another week and take part in one of the Adventure Treks!

### *Saluda Trek*

Begin the week learning how to do rock climbing and rappelling on the 40' tower. Then take to the water to learn the basics of sail boarding and kayaking on the big water. After you get that under your belt, take off for an overnight canoe trip down the Saluda River. This trek gives you a taste of high adventure on the water *and* above the ground.



### *Whitewater Trek*

Take off for the mountains for a memorable week. Spend three days hiking in the scenic Appalachian Mountains. Learn and practice the art of Scout backpacking with your crew. On the fourth day strap on your helmet for a whitewater rafting trip down one of the raging rivers of the Blue Ridge. Spend your last night sharing tales around the campfire before returning home.

The cost for each of these trips is just \$45 on top of the regular camp fee (or \$180 for in-council and \$195 for out-of-council). Boys attending camp for an adventure trek come as provisional campers and do not need to come the same week as their troop. They will be placed with troops at camp but will spend much of their time outside of Camp Barstow. Space for these trips is limited, so please register early.

## *Provisional Scout and Adventure Trek Application*

Please include a \$50 non-refundable but transferable deposit along with your application.

Complete fees must be paid by May 20, 1999.

All high adventure participants must be at least 14 years of age. All age requirements are as of January 1, 1999.

**For Scouts attending traditional summer camp with their troop, please register with the troop at a cost of \$135. DO NOT USE THIS FORM.**
